Despite being older than the average high-schooler and even though his primary and previous high school marks were quite low, Jerry did very well last year at Hagen Open campus and passed with high marks in Maths and English. He will continue his schooling and is expected to complete this year. He wants to be an Engineer and Economist to support the Orphanage.

Hagen Well Baby Clinic; and purchased all the needed baby equipment. As you can see from the picture below the baby is now doing really well, growing healthy and putting on weight.

The man pictured with the girls is their security guard who looks after them for no pay.
